Reflection on the Sunday Gospel (Sunday 6, Year A)

*“Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law”
(Matthew 5:17)*

Most of us have a complicated relationship with the law. We want it to protect us, to keep order, and to

defend what is right. At the same time, we often experience law as frustrating, restrictive, or out of touch with real life. We are also aware that laws change. What was once acceptable becomes forbidden, and what was once prohibited is sometimes defended as a right. Law reflects culture, and culture is always shifting.

Some laws even amuse us. In different parts of the world it is illegal to make faces at a dog, to mispronounce a place name, or to drive a car while asleep. These odd examples make us smile, but they also reveal something important. Law can regulate behaviour, but it cannot shape motives. It can restrain actions, but it cannot transform the heart.

This raises a serious question. Is breaking the law the same as committing a sin? Sometimes the answer is clearly yes. To kill, to steal, or to lie under oath are crimes and grave moral wrongs. Laws such as these protect life, trust, and the fabric of society. Other laws, such as speed limits or tax regulations, exist for the common good. Even when inconvenient, they deserve respect. To break them deliberately and selfishly is rarely morally neutral.

Yet not every sin is illegal. It is not against the law to be unfaithful, to harbour resentment, to manipulate others, or to live selfishly. These actions can cause deep harm in families, friendships, and workplaces, but the law cannot reach them. And sometimes the law itself is wrong. History gives us painful examples of laws that defended slavery, suppressed free speech, or denied people their dignity. There are moments when civil law and moral law stand in tension.

Into this complicated world Jesus speaks as Teacher. He does not dismiss the law, and he does not simply reinforce it. Instead, he fulfils it. He

reveals its deepest purpose. The law was never meant to be a checklist guaranteeing holiness. It was meant to guide people into faithful relationship with God and with one another.

Jesus insists that outward observance is not enough. Anger, he teaches, can be as destructive as violence. Contempt can wound as deeply as physical harm. Faithfulness is not merely about avoiding certain actions, but about the integrity of the heart. The Teacher leads us beyond surface obedience and draws us inward, to the place where choices are formed.



This is demanding teaching. It is easier to keep rules than to examine motives. It is easier to avoid certain actions than to allow God to change our desires. Yet this is precisely where Jesus teaches with authority. He shows us that the law finds its fulfilment not in fear or control, but in love.

Saint John Paul II reflected deeply on this in his teaching on moral conscience. He reminded the Church that law serves freedom when it is rooted in truth. Rules exist to protect love, not to replace it. When conscience is properly formed, the law becomes a guide rather than a threat.

We see this in everyday life. A generous person does not need rules about sharing. A faithful friend does not need constant reminders about loyalty. A parent who loves deeply does not need laws to tell them to care for their child. When the heart is shaped rightly, behaviour follows naturally.

Jesus, our Teacher, does not lower the moral vision. He deepens it. He calls us not merely to avoid wrongdoing, but to desire what is good. He teaches us that holiness is not about minimal compliance, but about generous love and integrity of life.

If we allow Christ to teach us, his law is no longer a burden. It becomes a path to freedom, written not on stone tablets, but on human hearts, alive with grace.

Giving for the Future

Planned Giving

Planned giving means making regular donations to the parish. You can set this up as you like - it does not need to be weekly - it could be monthly for example. We recommend **Standing Orders**, at intervals of your choice, from your Bank to the Parish. Please ask for a form from Church.

Occasional Giving

As well as planned giving, you may wish to give occasional amounts for special appeals and events, including second collections, to the parish and outside charities. Again, special envelopes can be used, but we recommend the Digital Collection Plate in Church or the links cannock.mydona.com for Cannock or bit.ly/olol-give for Hednesford. You can make donations in Church (by card, contactless or chip and pin) or online, wherever you may be.

Gift Aid

If you are a tax payer you can Gift Aid the tax you have paid, back to the parish. This means that for every £10 you give, the government will add a further £2.50. Only a small amount of paperwork is necessary. You can register for Gift Aid when you make a donation at cannock.mydona.com or bit.ly/olol-give or with a form available from Church.

Cashless collections

It would be a great help to the Parish if most parishioners paid your collection money by Standing Order. The Bank now charges us for paying in cash, while standing orders, especially with Gift Aid, bring extra, and regular, money into the parish.

Please pick up a copy of a form from church and return it complete with your details.

Please register your card for Gift Aid

Go to cannock.mydona.com or bit.ly/olol-give on your Internet connected device, (phone, tablet, laptop etc) and make a donation. Choose to Gift Aid it, and fill in the short form. The card you use will then be registered for gift aid, and all future donations to the parish using this card (online or in Church) will be increased by 25% by the taxman!

St Mary & St Thomas More, 100 Club

Rules of Operation

Purpose

The 100 Club is a small society lottery regulated by the Gambling Act (2005), and registered with Cannock Chase District Council by St Mary's Church, Cannock, a Small Non-Commercial Society run for the benefit of the Parish of St Mary & St Thomas More, Cannock, in its pastoral, cultural and community activities.

Rules

1. The 100 Club is run on an annual basis, from March to February each year.
2. Membership of the Club is open to any adult person who pays the annual subscription before the first draw of the year
3. Each member is allocated a number which is entered into the draw. Members keep the same number/s until they cancel their membership.
4. Members may have as many numbers as they wish, paying the subscription for each number.
5. There is no limit on the number of members.
6. The draw takes place quarterly as decided by the Parish Priest & advertised in the parish.
7. All communications of the 100 Club, including the announcement of the winners of each draw, is made in the weekly Newsletter of the parish, which is distributed in the Church and across social media.
8. Any prize which remains unclaimed after 12 months reverts to the Parish.
9. The levels of subscription, and the number of prizes are decided each year by the Parish Priest, and in consultation with the parish fundraising group, then are made clear to members at the time they pay their subscription.
10. All matters of interpretation and the variation of these rules are referred to the Parish Priest of *St Mary and St Thomas More, Cannock*, who acts in accordance with the guidance of the Licensing Authority, Cannock Chase District Council, as authorised by the Gambling Act (2005).

REVIEW OF 2025

International Negotiations:

June: U.N. Ocean Conference, Nice, France: 170+ countries supported the Nice Action Plan. Many new pledges made.

August: UN talks on plastic pollution; Geneva: ended without agreement, again. November: Climate COP30, Brazil. No progress on reducing fossil fuels burning. Some progress on finance for poorer countries, but absence of the US had a huge impact.

UK: The National Emergency Briefing, held on November 27, 2025, focused on the climate and nature crisis, presenting urgent evidence and solutions from leading experts.

At the end of his talk, Pope Leo posed this question: "I would like to conclude with a question that concerns each of us. God will ask us if we have cultivated and cared for the world that he created (cf. Gen 2:15), for the benefit of all and for future generations, and if we have taken care of our brothers and sisters (cf. Gen 4:9; Jn 13:34). What will be our answer?"

School Visit from Minister for Nature

Pupils from St John Fisher Catholic Primary School welcomed Mary Creagh MP, Minister for Nature, to discuss the importance of taking care of the environment and tackling climate change.

2026: A NEW BEGINNING FOR ME?

In *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis called for each of us to undergo a Conversion, - a change of mind and heart, with regards to caring for God's creation, for nature and the environment, and caring for the poor, the most vulnerable. He repeatedly reminds us that everything is connected.

Conversion is not a one-off event. It can begin with a huge upheaval, or just a silent resolution to do something. It always must be followed up with some actions, usually small, but these must become habitual, and then we continue with a further action and so on. We persevere.

Some suggestions: read *Laudato Si*, and *Laudato Deum*; Learn to reduce, re-use, re-cycle. (reduce means to consume less and avoid waste). Walk or cycle, rather than use the car; use public transport.; many more ideas online. Switch energy provider to Ecotricity, or similar, green energy company.

Proposed Calendar of Celebrations for England & Wales

Approved revision to the 1999 Archdiocesan Calendar

The revision was prepared by the working group appointed to carry out this work (including Professor Judith Champ; Mgr Bruce Harbert, Fr Paul Dean and, latterly, Fr Allen Morris).

The Archbishop consulted with his Archbishop's Council, the Chapter and the Councils of Deans, and of Priests.

Following this consultation, the revision was approved by the Archbishop on 8th July 2025. However the revised Calendar does not come into force, and may not be used, until it receives *recognitio* from the Holy See.

That *recognitio* will be requested when the work of preparing a revised Diocesan Supplement have been completed. The Supplement includes not only the Calendar, but also prayers and the Lectionary for the celebrations of the Saints and the Blessed, and – an addition to the the proposed new Supplement – readings for the Office of Readings.

The expectation is that the revised Supplement will be submitted to the Holy See for *recognitio* early in 2026.

At the same time an additional tranche of materials is being prepared to assist the clergy and lay faithful of the Archdiocese receive and make best use of the revised calendar – for example materials which will

- promote knowledge of the history of the Catholic church in the Archdiocese, including among incoming clergy and in schools
- foster devotion of all the faithful to our saints and blessed
- supporting worthy celebration of the Liturgy (including the Mass and Divine Office)
